All the tests include activities involving drawing, colouring or telling stories – ideal for motivating and inspiring children to learn.

Cambridge English: Starters

This test is for children who are just starting to learn English. Preparing for the test helps children learn basic sentences in English, build basic English vocabulary, and become familiar with English letters and numbers.

Cambridge English: Movers

This builds on children's language skills. Preparing for the test helps children understand basic phrases and instructions in English, express simple sentences in English, and identify many everyday objects.

Cambridge English: Flyers

Cambridge English exams for UK university admissions

Students from the EU, EEA or Switzerland

Students do not need a visa, but must meet the English language requirements of the university they are applying to.

Students from other countries

Students must apply for a student visa. The English exams accepted depend on the level of study, as shown in the table below.

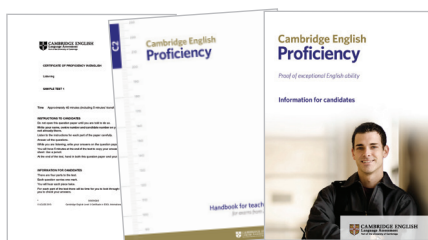

The Cambridge English Scale

Making our results easier to understand and compare

The Cambridge English Scale is a range of scores used for reporting the results of Cambridge English exams. It is built on our existing results reporting and years of research, and is designed to complement the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

- Easy to compare performance – the alignment of our exams to the CEFR, to *IELTS* and to each other is clear. Results on the scale also give a greater insight into candidate progression from one exam to the next.

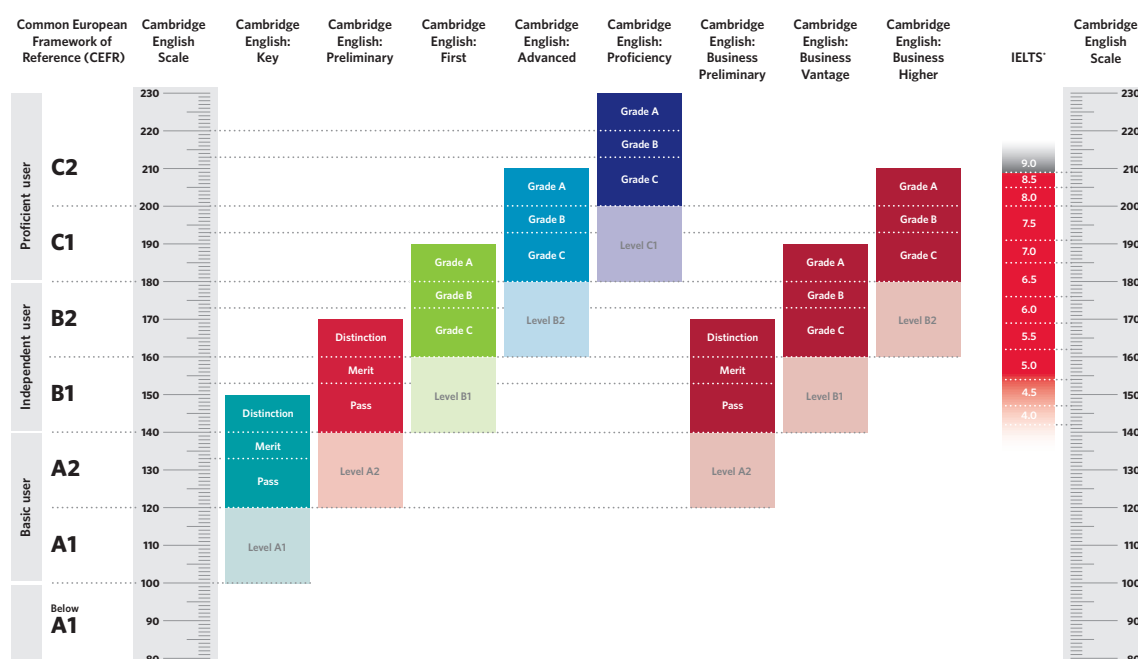
Benefits

- More detailed results – candidates receive a score for each skill (Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking) plus Use of English in certain exams*. They also get an overall score for the exam on the Cambridge English Scale.
- Straightforward and consistent – results across our exams report on the same scale. Scores on the Cambridge English Scale replace the standardised scores and candidate profile.

IELTS (International English Language Testing System) is the world's most popular English language test for higher education and global migration.

IELTS tests are held in over 1,000 locations across the world, with tests up to four times a month.

There are two versions of the test:

- **IELTS Academic** measures the English language proficiency needed for academic and higher education environments.
- **IELTS General Training** measures English language proficiency in a practical, everyday context. This version of the test is also often a visa requirement for those planning to migrate to English-speaking countries including Australia, the UK and New Zealand.

IELTS is jointly managed by the British Council, IDP: IELTS Australia and Cambridge English Language Assessment.
